### Year 9 and 11 Girls Netball v Hampton High

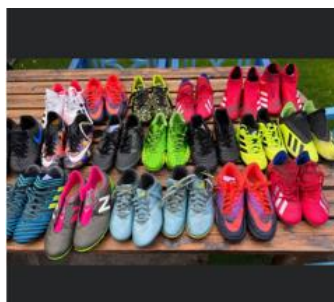
The Year 9 and 11 girls netball teams were in action last week, both playing against Hampton High.
