A Message from Mr O'Sullivan

"Reading is essential for those who seek to rise above the ordinary. It is how we discover new worlds, imagine the impossible, and bring our dreams to life."

Reading allows us to create mental imagery. In a world where media dominates, books give our brain the chance to create. Below are two extracts from my favourite novel, *The Day of the Triffids* by John Wyndham. As you read them, I'd like you to picture the scene in your head:

Passage 1

When a day that you happen to know is Wednesday starts off by sounding like Sunday, there is something seriously wrong somewhere. I felt that from the moment I woke, and yet I lay for a full minute or two more before I even opened my eyes. It wasn't that I could hear nothing; rather the contrary. I could hear too much. I could hear the sounds of movement, the movement of things that ought to be quiet. I could hear the rustle of leaves, the creak of wood, the flutter

of birds' wings, the distant hum of traffic—all the small, familiar noises that make up the background of life. But there was no sound of voices, no clatter of dishes, none of the everyday



sounds of human activity. The world had gone strangely silent.

Passage 2

I heard the sting whistle as it slashed out at me—but there was no knockout, no agonising burning, even. One's mind can move like lightning at such a moment; nevertheless, it was more instinct than reason which sent me leaping at it before it had time to strike again. I collided with it, overturning it, and even as I went down with it my hands were on the upper part of the stem, trying to pull off the cup and the sting. Triffid stems do not snap—but they can be mangled.

On the back page of today's newsletter, you'll find two images that were generated by AI in response to these two passages; I'm quite certain that what your mind is able to produce will outshine what the computer managed. It serves as a reminder that whilst technology is important, words and books cannot be replaced.

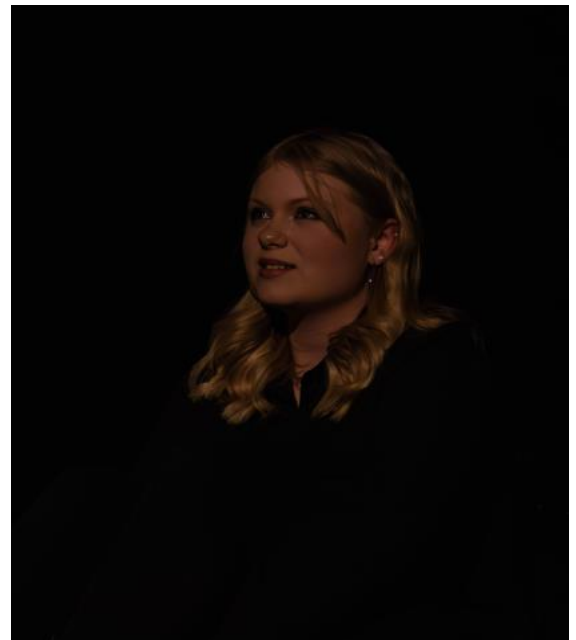
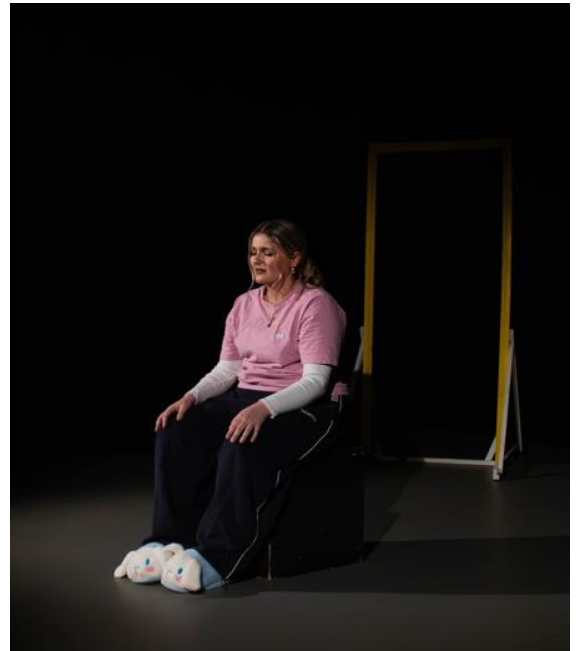

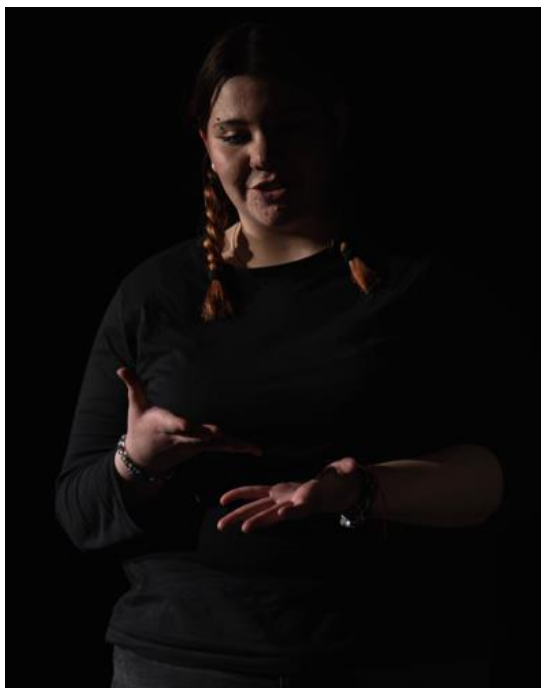
Year 13 Drama

Easter Residentials at Oxford University

Oriel College is delighted to announce 4 one-night residentials taking place during the school Easter holiday. These are designed for Year 12 students from UK state schools who are considering applying to competitive universities and aim to provide an insight into what life and study is like at an Oxford college. This year, the Study Days will be Law (13-14 April); Philosophy, Politics, and Economics (14-15 April); Women* in Maths and Computer Science (15-16 April); Women* in Chemistry and Biochemistry (16-17 April).

* for the two Women in STEM residentials, Oriel welcome applications only from students who identify as a woman or as non-binary.

On the first day of each residential, students will arrive at Oriel College in the afternoon, enjoying activities led by Student Ambassadors and the Oriel College Outreach Officer. The second day will consist of various academic taster activities led by university academics and outreach professionals, to provide more insight into the courses on offer at the university. All expenses (accommodation at Oriel, meals, and activities) are funded thanks to the generosity of an Oxford alumnus. Reasonable travel costs to Oxford to attend a Study Day will also be reimbursed.
