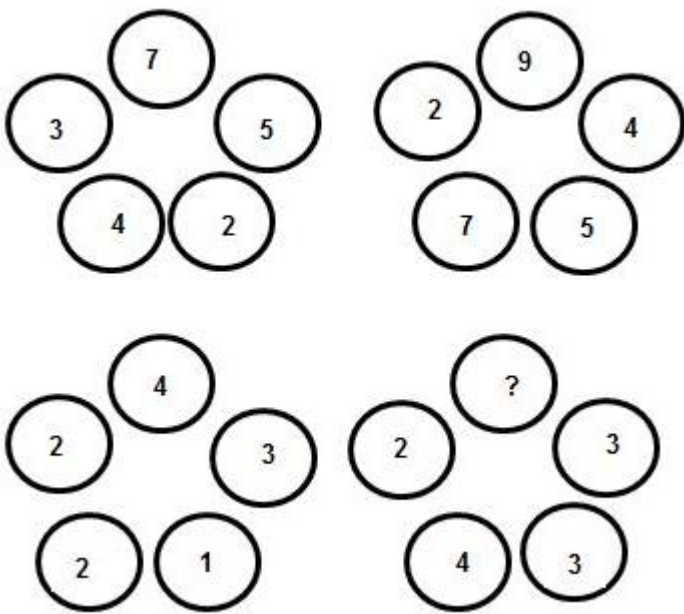


Labelling School Uniform
