

Year 7 writing to Parliament

Year 7 students were encouraged to write to their local MP about the refugee crisis after studying Shaun Tan's 'The Arrival' in English. Many wrote beautiful letters, asking them to intervene and act for the benefit of those suffering as a result of the war in Syria.

Adam Watson wrote:

Dear Dr Tania Mathias MP,

I am writing to you because I think that more refugees (especially from Syria) should be allowed into the country because they are like every single one of us. They have a family and a home like every single one of us so why should we not let them into our country?

Most of them have fled their homes and been through a treacherous journey just to be safe in this country and for people to say 'NO' is heart-breaking for them setting them back to square 1. Poor children are leaving everything that they cared about (friends and relatives) to come to Europe and to be told that they're not allowed in is just horrible. The war in Syria at the moment is horrendous, with thousands of lives being lost of not just military soldiers but innocent civilians dying trying to escape the madness.

Many refugees travel across dangerous seas or walk for days in the war-filled battlegrounds to find a safe place to call home. You should welcome refugees into the country but check them with a security scan in case they are carrying weapons. Give them food for the first few days here and then they can get a job so they will have enough money to get a job and get a flat/house.
