Holocaust Memorial Day

This week our Year 7s received an assembly in order to remember the Holocaust. Students were shown images from Auschwitz and learnt about a Holocaust survivor, Bettina Le Beau, who survived the ordeal and went on to star as a Bond girl in Dr No and as one of Benny Hill's extras in the 1980s. We would encourage parents to talk through the assembly with the students and remind them of why this event should never be forgotten. Specific teaching will take place in Year 8 and 9 in RP and History.
