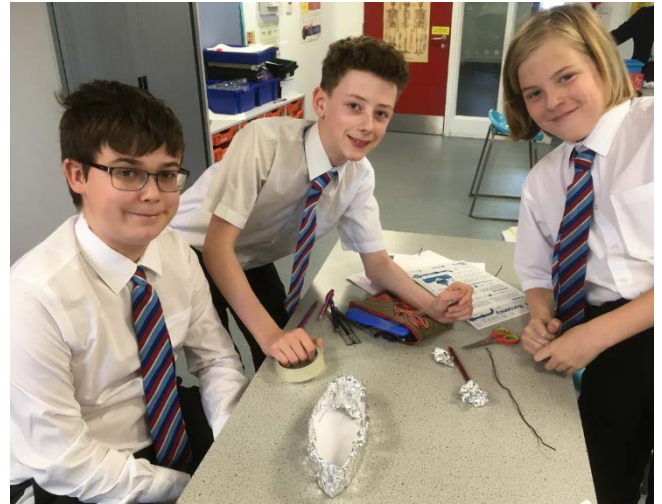




Marine Engineers workshop

The challenge was to design a boat that could hold the most marbles before it sinks. The estimate for year 8 students is about 120 marbles and the majority of the groups managed to get a lot more than that!

Kingston Hospital NHS Celebration – Careers Event

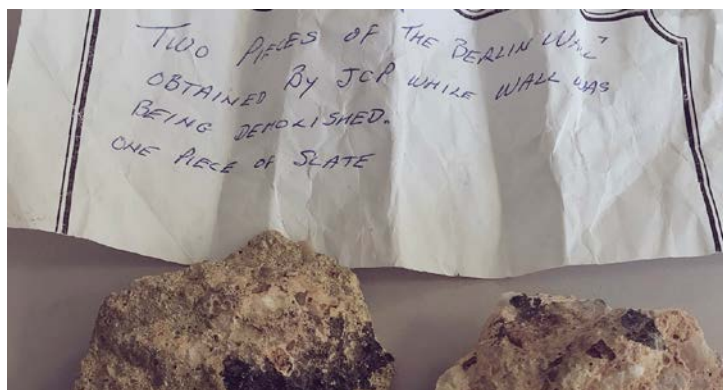


On Saturday 14 July, Kingston Hospital are holding an event for the NHS' 70th Birthday Celebrations.

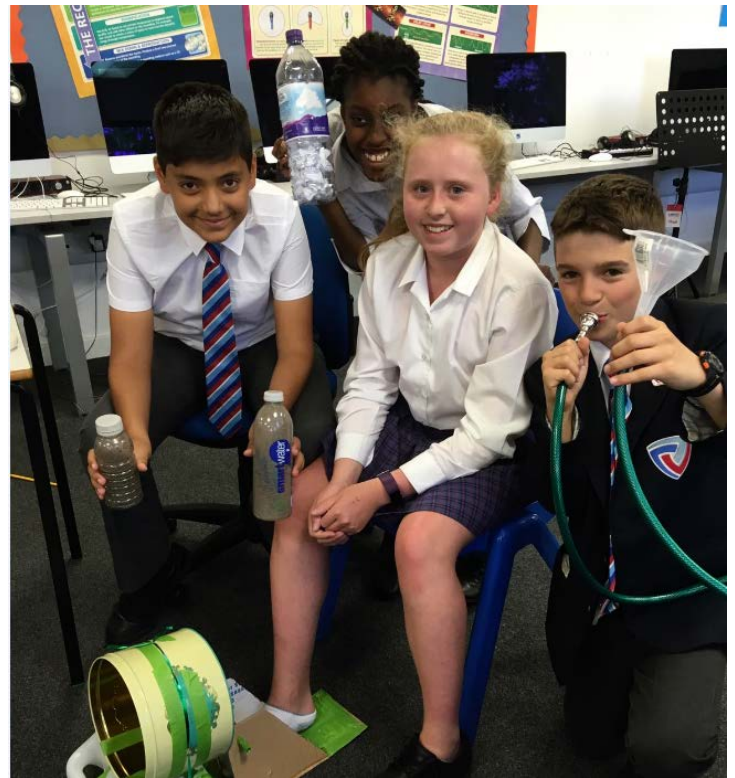

Pupils can wear their own clothes for this session.

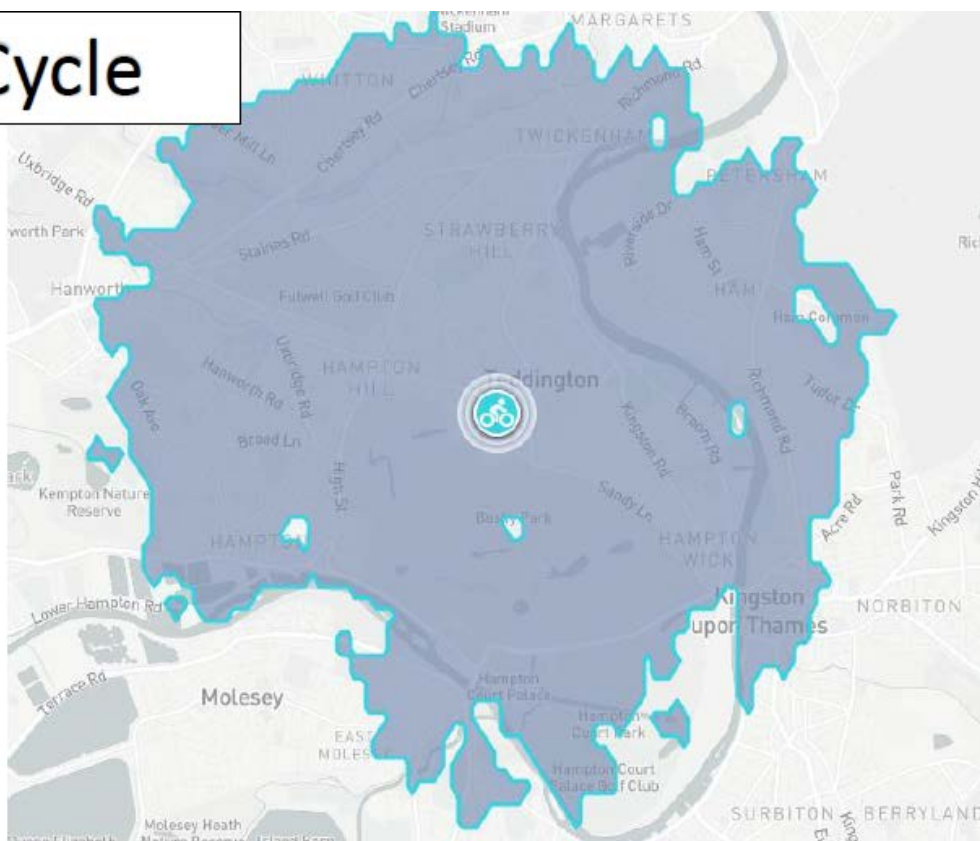
Sustainable Transport at Turing House School

At Turing House School we are very keen to reduce our impact on the environment. Where possible we encourage active travel (walking or cycling); if this is not possible then the use of public transport rather than private vehicles is preferred. The following maps show areas within 15 minutes of the Turing House Teddington School Site either by walking, cycling or using public transport.



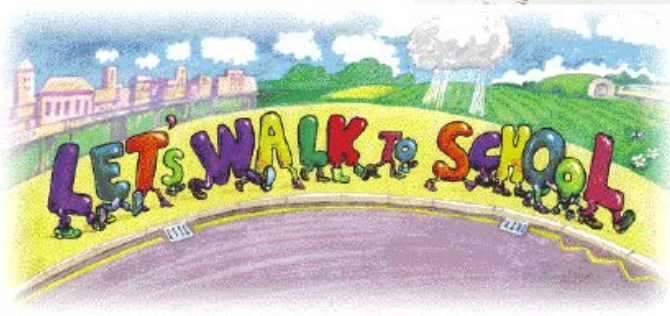
15 Minute Cycle

If you live ANYWHERE in the grey shaded area, then you are only at the maximum a 15 MINUTE CYCLE from school.



15 Minute Walk

If you live ANYWHERE in the pink shaded area, then you are only at the maximum a 15 MINUTE WALK from school.



15 Minute Bus/Train

If you live ANYWHERE in the orange shaded area, then you are only at the maximum a 15 MINUTE BUS or TRAIN journey from school.
