On the 29th of November, Dr Madeleine Garner, a Doctor at King's College Hospital, will be coming in to the Teddington site of Turing House School to lead a talk about careers in the NHS.

Madeleine will be discussing her journey from secondary school to becoming a doctor and giving advice on how to plan your application. Since qualifying from Nottingham University in 2016, Madeleine has worked in A&E, surgery, paediatrics and GP.

She has just started her specialist training in trauma and orthopaedic surgery at one of London's major trauma centres. She will also be able to share information on careers in nursing, physiotherapy and other roles in the NHS if this is something, which you are interested in.

Packed Lunches/Snacks – nut-free reminder

We would like to remind parents that, as we have several students with severe food allergies, we are a nut-free school.

We would therefore be grateful if you would ensure that you do NOT send items of food containing nuts into school in your child's packed lunch or as a break time snack. We also encourage students to eat their own food, rather than sharing with others, mindful that others may have severe food allergies.

SENECA

All students now have free access to Seneca - a revision and homework platform making studying more fun. Seneca is an interactive way to learn official course content.

The website covers 150+ exam board specific courses condensing what students need to know for their exams, and their software is able to identify gaps in learning. For instance, when you get a question wrong, the platform will repeat the topic in different formats and their smart algorithm has proven to make students remember topics 2x faster.

Students can sign up via senecalearning.com. Be careful though, as for your teachers to see how much work you have completed on there you will need to attach your account to their 'class'. If your teacher is tracking your work they will have a class code - e.g. History KS3 code is mNdZ-o9kp and History KS4 code is jqn_NVNTV.

In southern India, it celebrates the battle and subsequent defeat of the demon Mahishasura, who had vowed to engulf the earth in darkness, by goddess Shakti.


