

Did you like the old history club? Well it is now back on!





The first screening will be of 'Dunkirk'. This film was made in 2017 and tells the story of when in May 1940, Germany advanced into France, trapping Allied troops on the beaches of Dunkirk. Under air and ground cover from British and French forces, troops were slowly and methodically evacuated from the beach using every serviceable naval and civilian vessel that could be found.

At the end of this mission, 330,000 French, British, Belgian and Dutch soldiers were safely evacuated.


Spanish Lessons – Primary Visits
