

Turing House Sixth Form Dress Code

The aim of the dress code, designed in consultation with the Sixth Form Student Leadership team, is to allow students to express their individuality and sense of identity in an open, creative, and inclusive environment, while being respectful of the diverse backgrounds and beliefs of staff and students. We expect you to be dressed appropriately for the school environment, in keeping with the adults in the school.

If you need further guidance, please refer to the following list. However, it is not exhaustive, and we anticipate that sixth formers will use their common sense when considering what to wear and speak to their tutor if they are not sure. If there is any doubt, the Head of Sixth Form's decision will be final.

Clothing
Jeans are allowed so long as they are not ripped, torn, distressed, or faded
Clothing or bags must not display inappropriate/offensive logos, images, or text
No clothes with large graphics or logos (greater than 5cm)
No clothing that is see-through, cropped or ripped or where excessive skin or underwear is visible
No sports clothes (unless you have a PE lesson or school fixture)
Skirt length must be no shorter than 10cm from the top of the knee
No leggings (unless covered by a skirt or tunic)
No strappy or low-cut tops (unless covered by a shirt or blouse)
No onesies or loungewear
Smart shorts are allowed in the summer term. They must not be made of tracksuit (jersey) material and must be no shorter than 10cm from the top of the knee
Outwear such as coats, hats, hoods, gloves, sunglasses must be removed when inside the school building
Religious dress may be worn, but it must not cover the face
Hair and Nails
No extreme make-up or hairstyles
You may need to tie hair back for practical activities
Nails should be an appropriate length for practical subjects
Piercings & Tattoos
No visible tattoos
No extreme piercings (such as stretchers, nose/ear bars or other large accessories)
Footwear
Shoes must be smart, clean and in a good state of repair
Plain black trainers are acceptable
No unsafe shoes, such as flip-flops or excessively high heels

Identification
You will be issued with an ID badge and lanyard. These must not be altered and must be displayed at all times. This is important for our safeguarding procedures
If you lose or forget your ID badge, you must visit the office to obtain a temporary badge. Should a permanent replacement be required, this will be arranged at cost

As mature young adults, we expect all sixth formers to be able to self-regulate when it comes to application of the dress code. Students not adhering to the dress code may be sent home to change.
